THE FOLLOWING IS A STATEMENT FROM RITZHOLMAN CPAS

MILWAUKEE, WISCONSIN (11/03/16) – The RitzHolman family is emotionally devastated by the tragic results of a motor vehicle accident that occurred last night near Madison. The firm has learned that four of our dynamic young professional accountants were the victims of an allegedly intoxicated driver who struck their vehicle head on while traveling the wrong way on eastbound I-94. Kim Radtke, Clenton Hall and Katey Pasqualini, all highly respected Senior Staff Accountants at RitzHolman, died as a result of injuries received in the accident. Brian Falk, Supervisor at RitzHolman, received serious injuries and is undergoing emergency treatment.

Brian, Kim, Clenton and Katey were returning from La Crosse where they presented at a recruiting and networking event for UW LaCrosse accounting students. Due to their professionalism and outgoing personalities, they served as the leadership team for RitzHolman's outreach to and recruitment of young accounting professionals.

Our family at RitzHolman is shocked at this tragedy and the incomprehensible loss of three of our best and brightest. Kim, Clenton and Katey, all members of the Tax Department at RitzHolman, were dedicated to the communities they served and represented the firm and their profession in an exemplary manner. Their loss is devastating to colleagues, family, friends and clients throughout Southeastern Wisconsin. Brian is a highly respected supervisor at RitzHolman, where he serves as a model for the dedicated young professionals on the Audit Team. Our prayers are with Brian and his family as he fights to recover from the very serious injuries he sustained in this crash.

Please keep the families of Brian, Kim, Clenton and Katey in your thoughts and prayers as we all struggle to understand this senseless tragedy and unfathomable loss.
